
Radiant heat


Direct flame





If Homes Don't Ignite, Homes Don't Burn.


Homes with non-combustible roofs and 1.5 metres of non-combustible clearance have a significantly higher chance to survive a major wildland fire.














HOME IGNITION ZONE




HOME IGNITION ZONE

Form a FireSmart Neighbourhood Committee with the Champion as the main Committee representative


Have a Neighbourhood Wildland Fire Hazard

...encourages citizens to take actions that increase resilience to wildland fire.


- Annual, official day is the first Saturday in May
